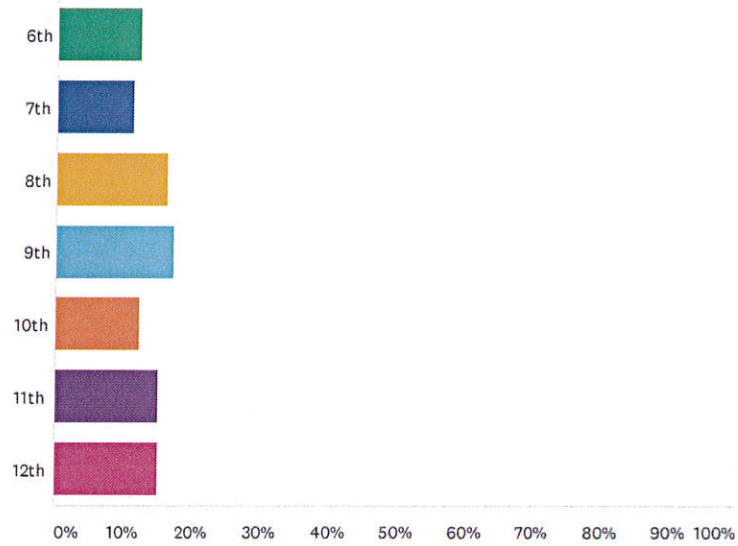

Q1 Please indicate your current grade level in the 2019-2020 school year.

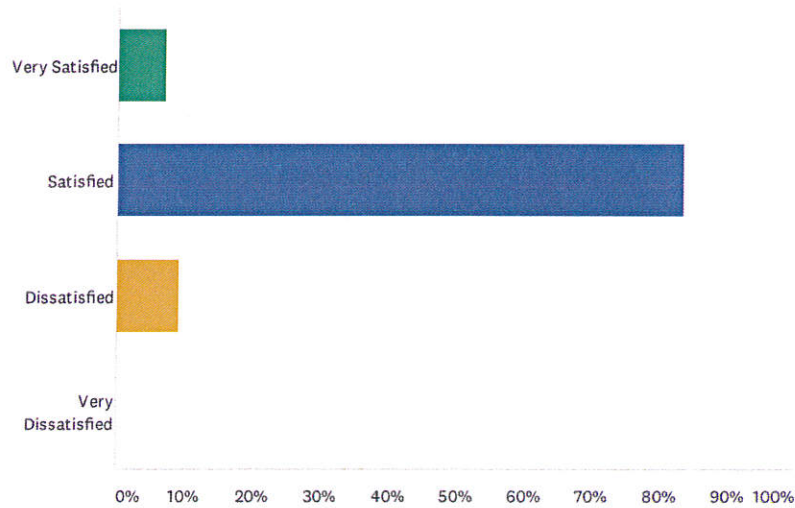

If possible, I would set up more Zoom meetings with teachers and students in the class. Possibly have the meetings early in the week to explain the assignments being given and answer any questions the students may have.

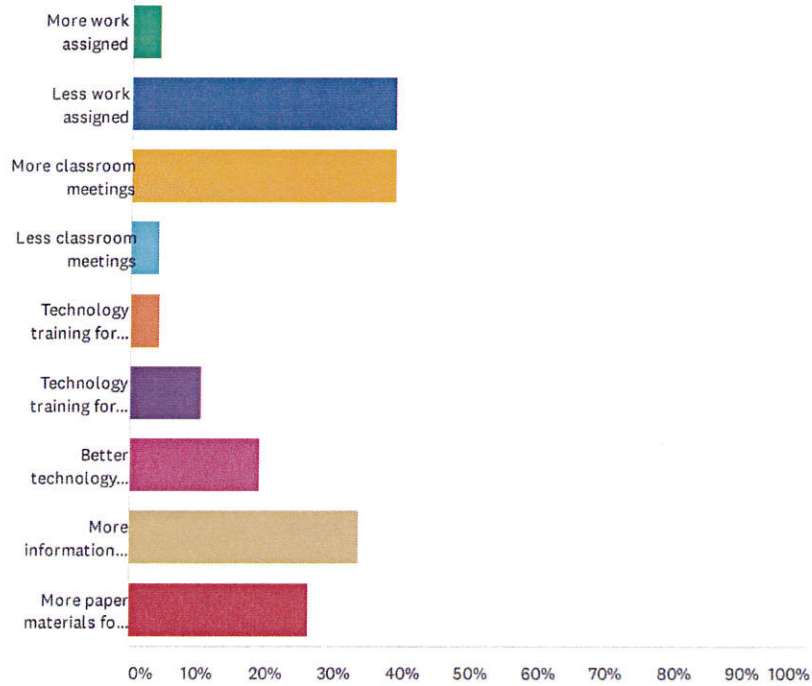
Teachers did very well on trying to get us work by trying to give us things that we could do in class but still be able to do at home

Some classes gave a bit too much work while others gave barely any. Also some teachers had pretty minimal student-teacher communication which was not helpful.

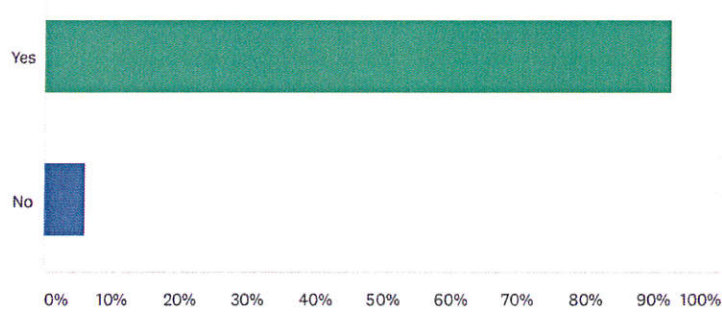
Physics was an in-school class that went well in person, being emailed work was not adequate for me to learn all I could.

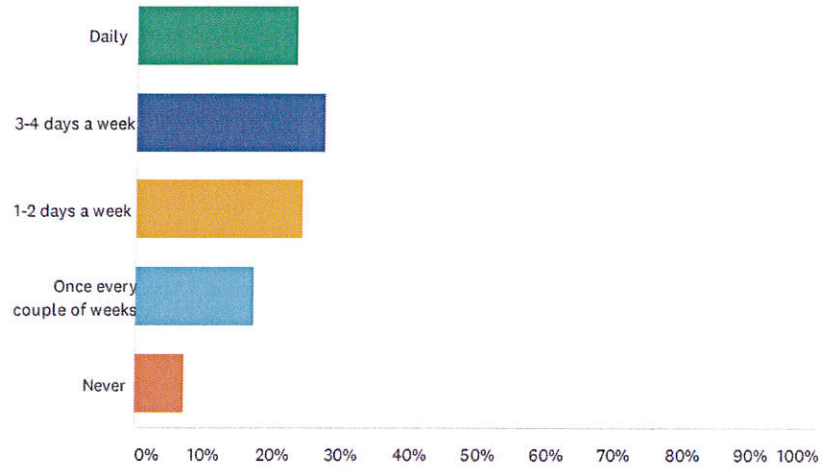
its not the best internet

During the shut down I didn't work on any but otherwise it was once or twice a week

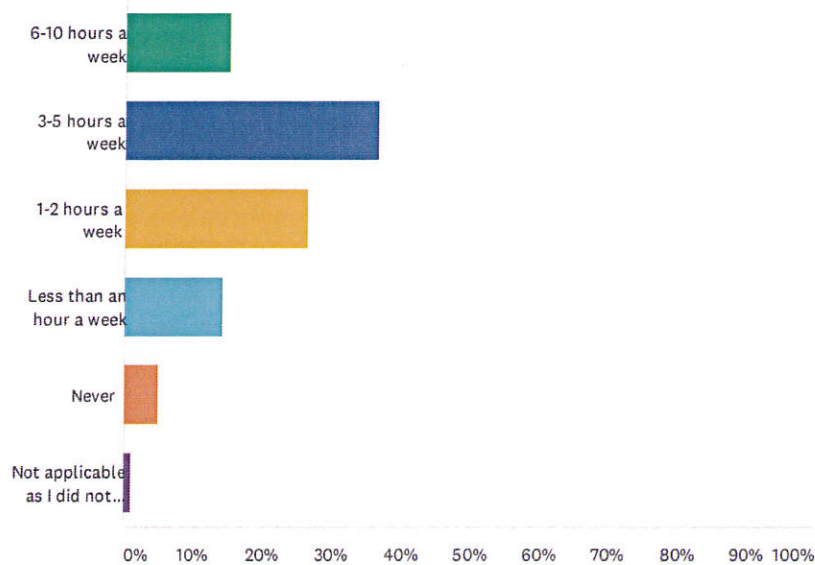
For my high school classes, I only worked on 1-2 days a week, but with onlines and Comp it turned into more of a daily thing.

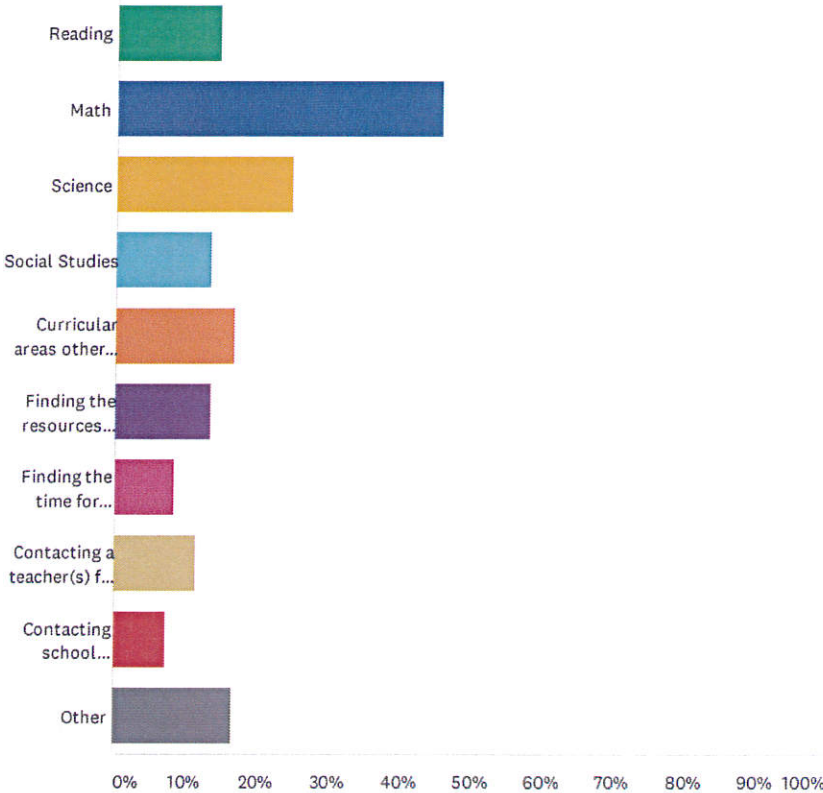
I only did the assignments that needed to get done to pass.

It was hard to find items for p.e for some of the activities but other than that I didn't have a problem

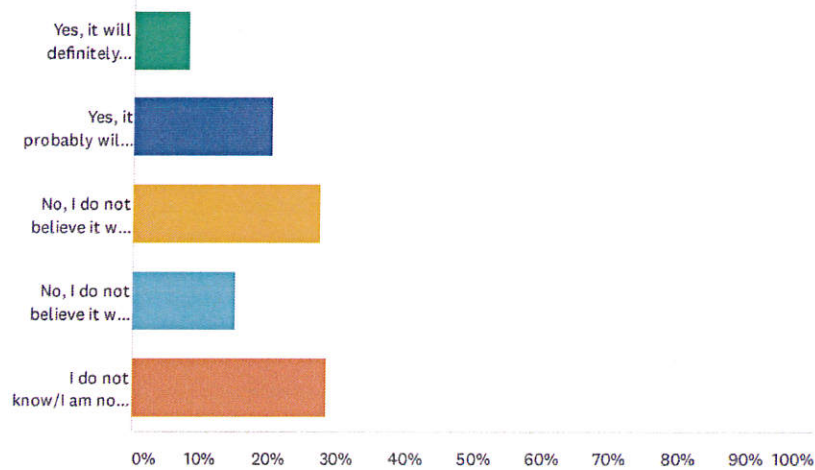
Algebra was really hard to learn without a teacher there to help me.
