Prom and Graduation

Graduation and Prom are upcoming, with Prom on May 1 at Horizon Hall and Graduation in the West Gym/Stage on Saturday, May 28. In regard to attendance at this time for both during the pandemic, the district has worked to make these events happen. While they may not be "the same" as some years, we are excited to offer these events to our students and families. Some basic details are below:

Prom-Juniors and Seniors can bring other Juniors and Seniors from other schools or a guest who has graduated (21 or under). This is limiting attendance from its normal amount in attendance, and will make the facility more compatible for COVID guidelines. All in attendance will be required to wear a mask except when eating and when 6-feet or more apart (this includes a mask while dancing).

Graduation - We are finding out how many people will be attending for graduates in their families (specifically parents, grandparents, and siblings including potential spouses of siblings). At one point we going to limit it to this number, but are now allowing anyone to attend, but we will seat parents, grandparents, and siblings of graduates together. Masks will be required, as social distancing will be limited (although we will have families, as described earlier, sit together).

School Board LOWERS the Tax Rate

As I mentioned last week, property tax rates will be lowered for our residents from 10.8840 to 10.8732 per \$1000. This follows a trend in our district, where we have consistently lowered the rates over the last several years. In comparison, our rate in 2016 was 12.2979 (this is a difference of over \$1.42 on the normal rate).
