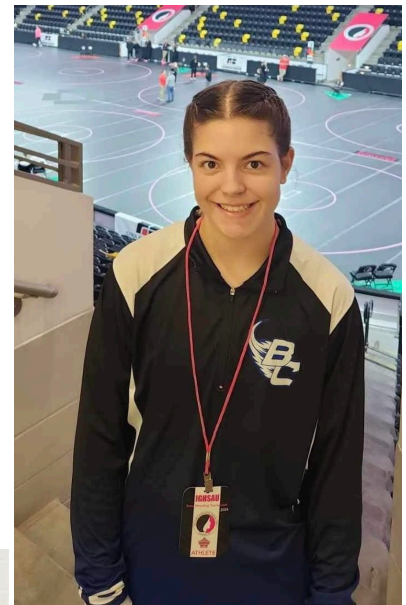


**Thinking, Innovating, and Adjusting**
