Whole-Grade Sharing Expansion with the Andrew CSD

The Bellevue CSD recently approved an expansion of the current Whole-Grade Sharing agreement with the Andrew CSD at a recent board meeting. The Andrew School currently sends any high school students to either the Maquoketa or Bellevue School Districts (parent/student choice), but next year this will expand to grades 7 & 8 also. Therefore, students in grades 7-12 in the Andrew CSD will have the option to attend either Bellevue or Maquoketa for the 2022-2023 school year as a result of Andrew only offering grades K-6 beginning next school year. Transportation is also provided by the Andrew CSD for these students.
